Ontario Supporting Small Businesses with Financial Advice and Training

"The project will also build one central portal where businesses can access digital tools and training, connect with mentors and industry experts, and get information on government programs to help them navigate COVID-19 and beyond. Through this network, up to 75,000 small businesses in Ontario can be reached.

The government is also providing \$131,000 for Chartered Professional Accountants of Canada to develop and deliver a four-part COVID-19-specific financial literacy tool kit for small businesses.

Ontario is also providing \$51,000 for Financial Advisors Association of Canada, a non-profit association of financial advisors, to provide pro-bono professional financial advice for small companies through its online platform, Advocis Connect."

The Indigenous Peoples Resilience Fund (IPRF) is an Indigenous-led effort to respond to urgent community needs while taking a long-term view on building community resilience.

Any Indigenous-led organization or Indigenous-serving organization working to foster resilience in Inuit, Metis and First Nations communities anywhere in Canada can apply for resiliency funds ranging from \$5,000 to \$30,000.

Despite the challenges faced by many tourism operators across the province, Jayden Symonds and Northwest Outfitters are doing just fine. Symonds runs year-round guided fishing trips on Lake of the Woods and rents out a fish house sleeper in the winter.

"I got into fishing at a really young age alongside my dad and grandfather and learning all there was to know from generations of experienced anglers. By the age of eight I was entered into my first competitive bass tournament and that is where I really got hooked.

I started to guide at the age of 15. Over the last five years I have learned an immense amount of knowledge about the Lake of the Woods area and have had much success.

Having action packed days and meeting people from all over the continent and having a blast out on the water is what I really enjoy about guiding."

Becky McCray & Deb Brown are the creators of <u>SaveYourTown</u>.

"Deb has a wealth of experience that includes leading a small town chamber of commerce, foreign casualty insurance underwriting, bartending, managing internet stores and luggage stores, selling knives, and working with small towns. Deb has lived in tiny towns, small towns, small cities and a major metro city.

Becky's career in small towns includes work as owner of retail stores, as city administrator for a municipality of 990 people, as an executive with rural nonprofits and as a teacher of computer and business classes. In 2004, she ran for state legislature, losing by just one vote per precinct. She believes we learn from both our successes and our failures, even when those failures are printed in the local newspaper. She makes her home in Hopeton, Oklahoma, a town of 30 people. She doesn't just talk about rural issues; she lives them."

Ryerson Diversity Institute - SMEs: Skills Gaps and Future Skills - report



"Canada's small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) account for more than 90 percent of private-sector jobs in Canada. To be competitive in today's market, they need the right people with the right skills, yet they are disproportionately threatened by labour shortages and skills gaps - a situation made worse by COVID-19.

Key Takeaways

40 percent of SMEs studied in 2019 identified skills shortages as a major competitive challenge, up four percent from the year before. SMEs facing labour shortages are 43 percent more likely to experience low growth, requiring their employees to work longer hours and incurring delays in services rendered. The need to further analyze the situation of skills shortages for SMEs in Canada is clear. It is paramount to clarify what skills are needed by organizations to be more agile and competitive. And it's key to develop proper HR practices that will allow for better recruitment, training (formal and informal) and retention of talent."

BDC: Canadian Entrepreneur Mental Health and Well-Being Report



"How has the COVID-19 pandemic affected the mental health of Canadian entrepreneurs? To find out, BDC surveyed 500 entrepreneurs to better understand their ability to cope with the crisis as well as their largest sources of stress and worries.

We find that while 64% of entrepreneurs reported having their business situation under control, close to two-thirds also reported feeling tired and unenergetic at least once a week."
